Under 18s FREE (within a family group)

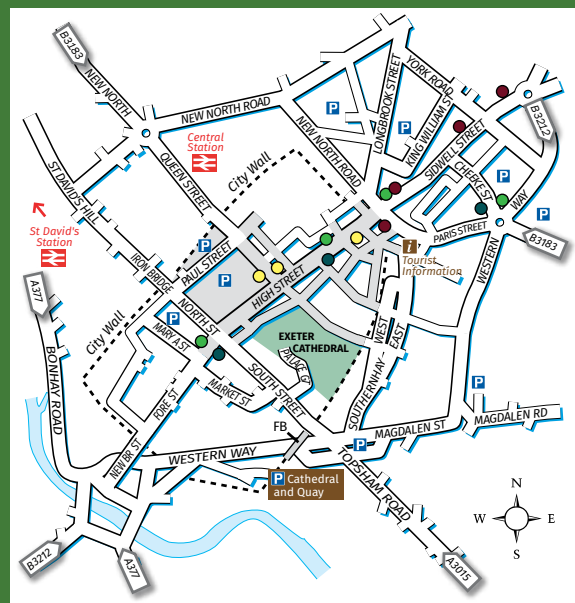
Getting Here

By car

Exeter is easily accessible via the M5, A30 and A38. Please use Park & Ride locations on the approaches to the city. City centre stops for these services are shown below.

- Honiton Road (M5 Jn29, A30 East)
- Sowton (M5 Jn30, A376, A3052)
- Matford (A38 West, A30 West, A379)

Public transport

Exeter has two main-line rail stations, Exeter Central and Exeter St David's. Exeter Central Station is a few minutes walk from the Cathedral, whilst Exeter St David's Station is further away. Bus service H travels between the city centre and Exeter St David's Station. City centre stops for these services are shown above by ●.
